

Coronavirus: The New Rules

What do I need to know and do?

Wear a mask

From 8 am until 10 pm, you must wear a mask in central Frankfurt and on all shopping streets – see the back of this flyer.

You must wear a mask when using trams, metros, urban trains and bus services.

Limit your contact with others

Physically distance from other people and reduce your contact with others. It is best to limit your contacts to just the people who live with you.

No more than 5 persons from two households may meet with each other in public spaces in Frankfurt.

What are the rules for schools and childcare?

Schools and childcare facilities will remain open. They must also observe special hygiene rules.

What are the rules for daily life and recreation?

Restaurants, clubs, bars and pubs must close. Delivery and takeout are allowed. Supermarkets, wholesale and retail stores will remain open.

No alcohol may be consumed in parks, on busy streets or public squares. In addition, alcohol is prohibited from 11 pm to 6 am in all public spaces throughout the city.

Recreational facilities in Frankfurt am Main, such as the theatre, opera, zoo, the Palmengarten and swimming pools, will remain closed.

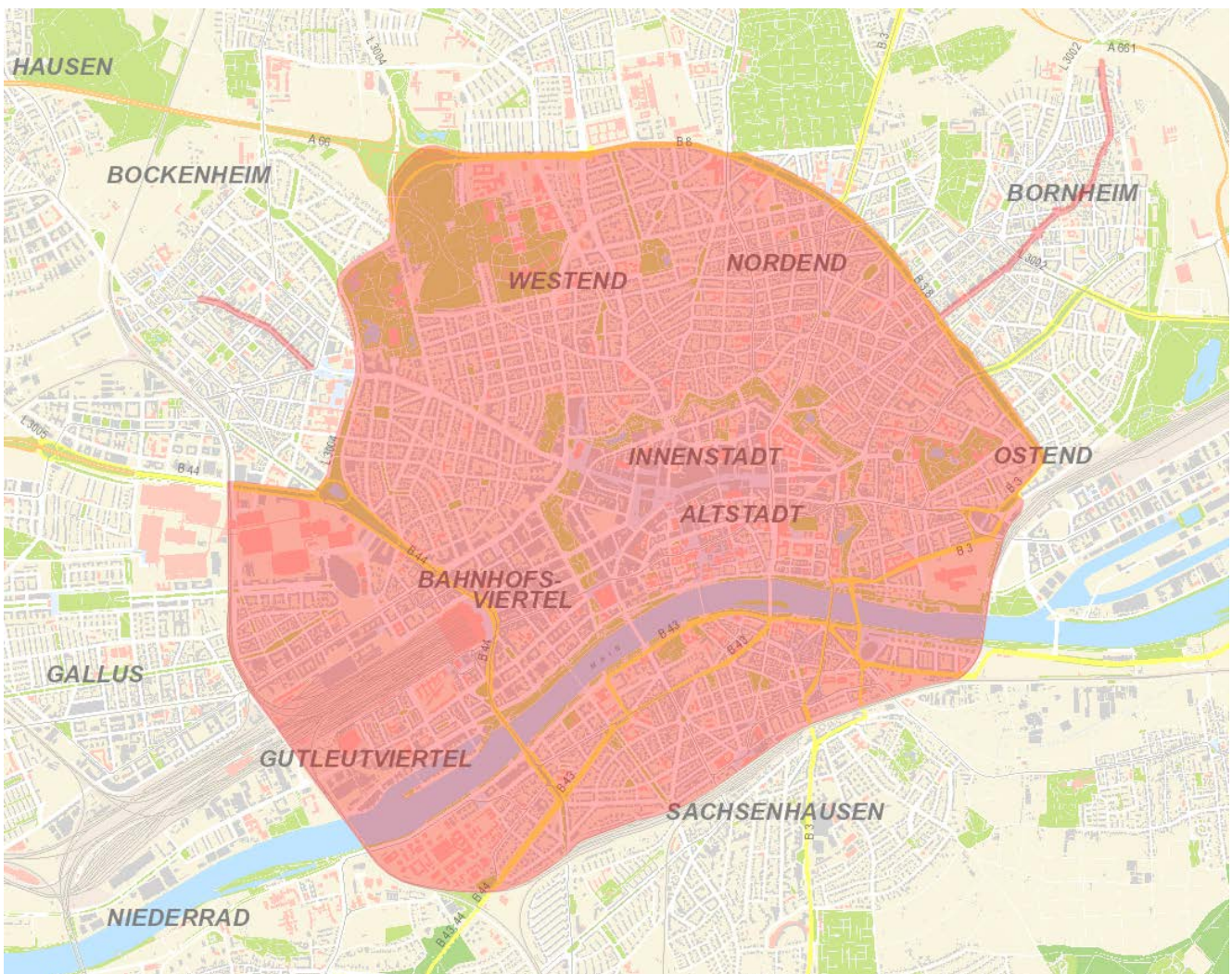
